Message from Rick Gans:

Your library board at work!

We've been busy, finalizing our strategic planning initiative. Our consultant has now delivered draft documents, some of which we've approved, and all of which are on the library website. Final revisions are being done by our consultant, correcting some small issues. Our next step, as a board and staff, is to distill all the information into a workplan, something we will begin at our January board meeting.

Of special note is the facilities analysis. Our consultant, based upon the community survey, focus groups, our strategic retreat, and comparisons to comparable libraries, came up with two suggested facility needs, one based upon just our year round population, and another that would also adequately serve our much larger summer population. The plan goes into great detail as to how many square feet would be needed in our library to serve the various functions identified from their process. Our current library is around 2600 square feet; the plan suggests a need of around 7600 square feet to serve our year round population and almost 12,500 square feet to serve our summer population! It's a very detailed analysis (142 pages!) – we would love to get feedback from anyone!

Hope to see you at our next board meeting! As always, feel free in the meantime to reach out with questions and comments.
