Library now a Top Priority in Capital Improvement Plan!

As a result of the November joint meeting of the Leelanau Township Board and the Township Planning Commission, library improvement and expansion has moved up in priority to the Urgent level. Supervisor, Doug Scripps, has formed a group to conduct a feasibility study considering expansion of the library and relocation of the township offices. They will have an architectural study done along with financial estimates.

If you are wondering why our library needs improvement and expansion here are some of the most pressing obstacles we face.

- We do not have a public restroom in the library or a handicap accessible restroom in the Township building
- We do not have adequate wiring or enough electrical outlets for the technological and electronic needs of the staff and the public
- We do not have quiet areas for the public to work
- Our shelves are totally full and are not handicap accessible
- The Children's Corner is too small to accommodate all our programs
- Adult programs can overfill our open area & there is only one exit
- We lack adequate storage space this is a big problem
- We do not have a kitchen or place to eat or prepare food so we end up using the 4 x 4 bathroom for our kitchen needs. Unsanitary!
- Since the library building opened in 1968 (47 years) there have been no expansions or structural improvements

Library Funding:

A majority of our library funding comes from Leelanau Township Property Taxes, allocated by the Leelanau Township Board, who also serve as the library board. As long as we budget and spend 3/10ths of a mil in local property tax dollars, we are eligible to receive State Aid. Distributed by the Library of Michigan, state aid delivers a small per capita payment each year. We also receive a portion of county penal fines, excluding court costs, again distributed on a per capita basis. Penal fine totals vary each year in accordance with the number of traffic tickets & fines issued in our Township. The Friends of the Library donations, individual donations, grants, video fees, material replacement fines, and printing fees make up the remaining income. Our library does not collect a separate millage or receive Federal funding other than grants.
